Legislative Bills Related to Education

House Bill 520, which allows charter schools in Kentucky for the first time; and Senate Bill 1, which will effectively repeal the Common Core standards and calls for several other reforms, got the most attention. But Kentucky Department of Education officials updated state board members last Wednesday about more than 40 other new laws that will affect elementary and secondary students and classrooms, including:

- Senate Bill 159, which requires all public high school students to pass a civics test in order to receive a regular diploma.
- House Bill 128, which requires the Kentucky Board of Education to establish an elective social studies course on the Bible.
- Senate Bill 17, which permits students to voluntarily express religious or political viewpoints in school assignments free from discrimination. Religious and political organizations are allowed equal access to public forums on the same basis as nonreligious and nonpolitical organizations.
- Senate Bill 50, which allows school calendar flexibility for districts adopting a school calendar with the first student attendance day no earlier than the Monday closest to Aug. 26.
- Senate Bill 117, which allows a veteran with a bachelor's degree in any area to be issued a provisional teaching certificate if other criteria are met.
- House Bill 206, which provides Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES) funds to students enrolled in a registered apprenticeship program.
- House Bill 241, which prohibits a coach from returning a student to play sports who is diagnosed with a concussion; prohibits a student from returning to play if no physician or licensed provider is available to conduct the required concussion evaluation; and prohibits a student who does not receive the required evaluation from returning to play in a subsequent practice or competition unless written clearance from a physician is provided.
- House Bill 269, which allows relatives who are currently ineligible for employment in a school district to serve as substitutes for a certified or classified employee under certain conditions. House Bill 277 removes the local board of education member eligibility restriction that no aunt, uncle, son-in-law, or daughter-in-law be employed by that board.

Those bills with an emergency provision take effect immediately on the signature of Gov. Matt Bevin. The rest will take effect on June 29, state officials said.

In addition to the new laws, schools will have a new rating and accountability system to work under later this year from the Kentucky Department of Education.

MAMMOTH CAVE TRIP

A group of students through the 21st Century Program, alongside Ms. Dishman and Ms. Cindy wrote a grant through the National Park Federation. To receive the grant students must also had to write a paper including research about what they would hope to learn about Mammoth Cave. CCMS students Alex Cawthorne and Matthew King wrote and submitted the student part and were awarded the grant for CCMS. Students learned that there are over 160 species of animals; 400 openings into the cave; gypsum within the cave is used in toothpaste and drywall; cricket dung is called frass, and is used to feed other animals within the cave; there are 13 species of bats; invasive species and so many other interesting facts. Students also had their shoes sprayed off to eliminate spreading the "white nose

syndrome" to bats on the outside. Ms. Cindy stated "it was a fantastic day of learning and students really enjoyed it!"

Instruction and Assessment**

- Preparation for End of Course testing is our main focus for RTI classes.
- Juniors are beginning to receive ACT composite scores. Students receive the scores prior to our receiving them.
- KOSSA scores were reported to us on Friday, April 14.
- 41/65 seniors are college and/or career ready. 24 are both, 7 are college only, 8 are career only, and one student in an alternate program is ready. With 12 bonus points for students having obtained both, our CCR percentage is at 82.
- Students continue to test with KYOTE, WorkKeys, and on Industry Certifications, which will determine college and/or career readiness.
