II.b. Superintendent's Report

Rationale:

Unbridled Learning Accountability Scores are in! Good news for Cumberland County Schools! First time in our history that we are a DISTINGUISHED district! District overall is ranked 34 out of 173 districts in KY, up from 101 last year! 92nd percentile; most improved district in the top 40; 4th most improved overall out of 173 districts! High school is ranked 78 out of 228 high schools in KY, up from 110 last year! 91st percentile. Middle school is ranked 67 out of 327 middle schools in KY, up from 215 last year! 91 percentile. Elementary is ranked 358 out of 712 elementary schools in KY, up from 485 last year! 73 percentile. As a district, we outscored all surrounding districts (Monroe, Metcalfe, Clinton, Adair, Russell, Barren, Allen, Wayne, Warren, Bowling Green)! Celebration Parade Planned for Oct. 16
